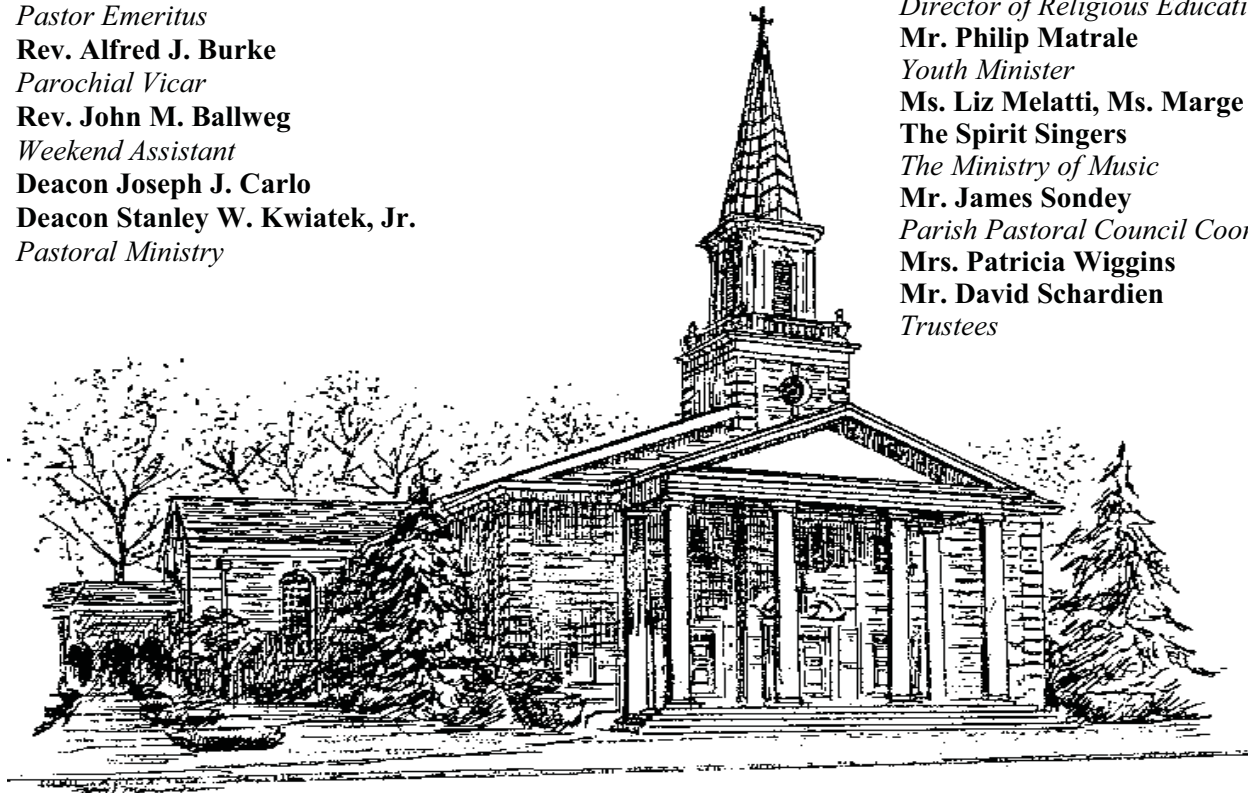

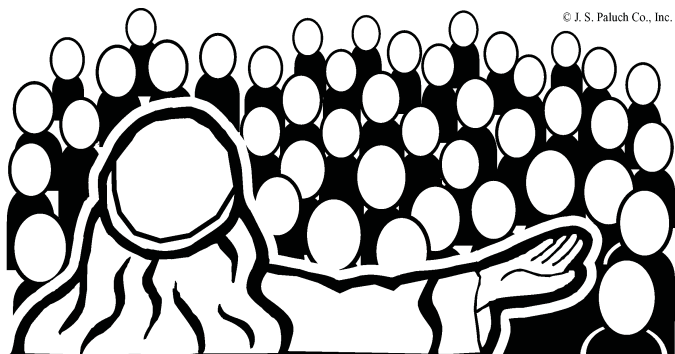

A message from our Pastor:

Dear Parishioners,

Lent is the time for the faithful to be “ever more attentive to the word of God and prayer, to prepare themselves by penance for the renewal of their baptismal promises at Easter. The virtue and practice of penance is a necessary part of the preparation for Easter. Penitential practices such as fasting and abstinence are to be encouraged by the Church.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2010 LENTEN REGULATIONS

- The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
 On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
 On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
- The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially”, or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 21, 2010 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 30, 2010.**

*Canon 920, 1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

**In preparation for Friday night's prayer service, please read the story of Martha and Mary (Luke 10:38-42), included below.**

<sup>38</sup>As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. <sup>39</sup>She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. <sup>40</sup>But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

<sup>41</sup>"Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, <sup>42</sup>but only one thing is needed.<sup>[a]</sup> Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

Martha felt that she couldn't get out of the kitchen and felt overwhelmed by her responsibilities there. A pot or a spoon might symbolize her situation.

**Think about a time when you felt overwhelmed as Martha did. It could have been yesterday! What item would symbolize that situation for you? Please bring that item with you for Friday night's prayer service. For example, if you are constantly in the car driving your children to various activities, you might bring a Matchbox car or a picture of a car. If you're forever babysitting, you could bring a calendar.**
